A summary of the meeting held at Rosley Hall on Monday 15th August. Councillor D Fairbairn attended. Ten members of the public were also present.

1. a general discussion on Wind Energy, the council agreed to liaise with and support other local councils on this matter see summary below. 2. The Queen's Diamond Jubilee 2012:- nationally a chain of beacons has been proposed. Mr M Watson offered a site within the parish. At the next meeting there will be a discussion on how this event can be celebrated in the parish. 3. Broadband: - 238 households (77%) in our parish have now registered an interest in receiving better broadband - see summary below. 4. First Responders:- see the Village Agents report for details. The council agreed to donate £400 to help cover the costs. 5. The audit of accounts is now available for inspection. 6. Highways:- consultation is taking place on the North Allerdale Traffic Regulations Order Review, three items relate to the parish a. egress only at Tracentree b. no parking outside Rosley School during school hours c. width restriction (except for access) on the Rosley to Welton road via the narrow bridge near Chalkside. Other highways issues - d. on Brocklebank recently erected warning signs ref. horses are sited too close together e. the road at the bridge near Raise Lodge has still not been repaired causing a serious problem with water run off. f. the Highways Steward, who now works as part of a team, has not been in the parish for sometime, enquires are to be made as to why and when they are due. 7. a fence has been damaged on parish land near Beck Bottom 8. Grey Squirrels - traps are available to try and control the spread of grey squirrels if anyone would like more details please contact Bill Brown. The Chairman thanked the members of the public for attending the meeting and for their input to the discussion on wind energy. He added that the public are always welcome at all parish council meetings. Please note this is just a brief summary of the meeting, a draft of the full minutes is available from the clerk or will be posted on the website within one week of a meeting.

Windfarm Concern

Following an Appeal by the applicant, the Planning Inspectorate has granted planning permission for the proposed 70 m anemometer mast at Reathwaite Farm, Brocklebank, with costs awarded against Allerdale Borough Council.

As a follow-up to the Parish Council Chairman's comment in May that the parish would have to decide what their position was on wind turbines and digesters, the Parish Council, on 15th August, agreed to support a public meeting, on a date to be arranged, to present and discuss important issues related to industrial-scale wind farms. Present thinking is to arrange such a meeting as soon as possible after any wind farm planning application is submitted.

In view of the increasing threat of more windfarms along the northern fringe of the Lake District National Park, the Council agreed to liaise with other parish councils in the area to support each other where appropriate. This item was discussed in response to an approach from Boltons Parish where two energy companies are doing environmental impact assessments of schemes which would add a total of 11 large turbines alongside the existing 3 turbines at High Pow.

Broadband - www.northernfellsbroadband.co.uk

Across the 7 parishes of the northern fells, registered support stands at 58% of the community. This is a fantastic show of support and has contributed greatly to raising the profile of Northern Fells Broadband with MPs, BDUK, telecoms suppliers, and the County Council. Funding: £16.8m has been awarded to Cumbria for rural broadband delivery. The County Council may add additional funds and further sources of funding might include Defra and the EU. There are four pilot schemes for broadband delivery in the UK and Cumbria is one, with the County Council taking full responsibility for the management of the scheme. For clarity community projects which may be implemented before the completion of the Cumbria County Council procurement process are now being labelled "Technical Pilots". BDUK invited Northern Fells Broadband to present to an Industry Day on July 8th and, following the day, selected the group [along with Eden Valley Digital and Garsdale and Dentdale] to further develop its proposal in the form of a business case. We have been accepted by BDUK as a Technical Pilot and we will now be working hard to secure possible funding grants.
